

School Wide Expectations

Our school social development committee, with input from staff and students, has developed common school expectations. These procedures are 1) reviewed at the beginning of the year by every classroom teacher; 2) posted in classrooms and in locations throughout the school; and 3) reviewed periodically as part of the school news broadcast. By using common, consistent language with students, children are provided with coherent, predictable expectations within grade levels, across grade levels, and in all school settings.



Assemblies:

Walk quietly entering and exiting the assembly
Sit crisscross on your bottom
Hands in your lap
Face forward
Eyes on speaker
Stay still on your bottom the whole time until the teachers say to get up

Lunch:

Walk at all times
Use conversation voice
No sharing food
Keep table and floor neat
Raise hand to clear or use bathroom
Use good table manners: Chew with mouth closed, No talking when chewing, Hands to self, Keep personal space, Use "please" and "thank you", Use school appropriate language and topics



Recess:

Everyone plays
Share equipment
Invite others to play
Work together to have fun
Get help from a grownup if a problem isn't settled quickly
Help others up if they fall

Arrival/Dismissal/Bus Line:

Stay in class line

Walk down the ramp and walk into your bus line and walk to your bus

Sit by grade level in the bus lines

No saving spots

Use conversation voice

Walk patiently and pay attention

Speak respectfully and appropriately

Be responsible with your surroundings including using lockers, gathering supplies and moving safely

**Hallways:**

Walk quietly, stay in class line

Quiet lockers

Use conversation voice

Yield to other classes or teachers

Wait patiently if stopped

Hands to self

Go directly to your destination

School Bus:

Stay seated in your seat (back against the seat, bottom on the seat, facing forward)

Sit by your grade level

Use conversation voice and appropriate language; talk to your neighbors

Pay attention and listen to the bus driver

Keep the center aisle clear of feet, backpacks and instruments

Keep hands and feet to yourself

Pay attention to your bus stop

Keep the bus neat and clean
